BIBLE TEACHIING OUTLINE FIRST FRUIT Lev. 23:10-11, Gal. 6:16, Ex. 34:26; Neh. 10:34-35

1. INTRODUCTION

The place of divine revelation knowledge under the auspices of the Holy Spirit in this end time dispensation can never be over emphasised.

Ouite a number of issue or Bible based doctrines which were hitherto unknown to us are coming into limelight - Dan. 12:4. Such doctrines as the use of anointing oil, the possibility of prosperity for the righteous divine healing etc.

It is a matter of fact that about three or four decades ago, the offering of TITHE was completely alien to the Anglican Communion, at least in this part of the world. It was indeed treated like a sacrilege or an abomination. Today however testimonies abound as touching the unprecedented blessings which tithing alongside other forms of Christian giving have brought into the adherents of such Bible based doctrine and practice.

2. FIRST FRUIT

First fruit is unarguably another aspect of Christian giving which is coming into limelight by revelation knowledge with attendant testimonies -Eph. 1:15-19. While thanking God therefore for past efforts in same regard in recent time, it would amount to a pastoral disservice; if

- We are not reminded about first fruit 2 Peter 3:1 (1)
- We are not sensitized about first fruit (2)
- (3) We are not encouraged about first fruit

These are the aims of this teaching.

3. THE BIBLE ON FIRST FRUIT

- (A) Lev. 23:10-11 Exod. 34:26, Deut. 18:4, Deut. 26:2-3.
 - Exod. 22:29-30, Gen. 4:3, Numb. 18:12.

(B) CHRISTIANS AND THE ISRAEL CONNECTION

- (1) God's promise was to Abraham and his seed Gen. 12:7, Gen. 13:15-16.
- (2) The seed in the singular sense is Jesus Christ Gal. 3:16.
- (3) Christians are therefore Abraham' seed by our faith in Christ's Jesus – Gal. 3:29.
- (4) We are therefore expected to see ourselves as Israel of God, follow the path of Abraham, key into Go's promises for Him and claim them. Gal. 6:16.

FACTS ABOUT FIRST FRUIT (C)

- We are the Israel of God Lev. 23:10-11. We are the (1)spiritual Israel - Gal. 6:16.
- `Entering into a new year or a new experience is (2)spiritually synonymous with entering into the land given to us by God i.e. 2017.
- (3) All references to the first fruit are in connection to farm products or the act of one's labour.
- Since most of us all of us are not farmers today, put in (4) perspective we have the labours of our hands which we constantly seek the blessing of God on.

O. TEST FOR TRUE WORSHIP AND SERVING GOD

How faithful are we in the elements of worship i.e. Prayer, Thanksgiving, Reading Holy Scripture, Fellowship, Sacrificial Offering, Church Attendance etc. Can we still do whatever we are doing to serve God now even when nobody acknowledges appreciate and give us monetary reward?.

P. <u>CONCLUSION</u>

True worship is integral and desirable in our Christian commitment. None of us must also be idle in the house of God as far as serving God is concerned. We must therefore worship and serve the Lord. The greatest way to serve God of course is to win souls for the Lord and His kingdom. Without sounding judgemental, it is expedient in the spirit of Vestry meeting that we assess ourselves as touching true worship and our serving of God to the end that we might resolve to do much more better in the years ahead. 1 Cor. 11:28-31.

5. THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK SUNDAY, 24TH FEBRUARY, 2019 THEME: GOD'S HEALING POWER READINGS: II KINGS 5:1-14; PSALM 77:1-15; JAMES 5:13-16a; MARK 2:1-12.

The theme of our meditation today is **God's Healing Power.** Healing is a removal of sickness and restoration of wholeness of health. Sickness, which is the condition for healing, entails all anomalous state whether physically, spiritually, or emotionally in individual, community or nation. Both men and nations are miserably sick today and in dire need of healing. For our meditation, we shall simply look at some facts about God's healing power, especially as it relates to our lections for today, with the aim of helping us to benefit maximally from it.

1. God desires that we be healed from diseases and afflictions:

God has always desired a comprehensive, i.e. body, soul and spirit health package for us (1Thess. 5:23; 3 John 2). Sickness is consequent on the Fall and so, true healing is a restoration that stems from salvation that was wrought for us through the sacrificial works of the Lord on the Cross. Prior to this, God demonstrated His desire for our healing when He made tunic (garment) of skin and used it to cover Adam and his wife at the Fall. He removed their shame and healed them of their emotional trauma.

2. Sin is a hindrance to God's desire for our healing:

God, who described Himself as the LORD that heals (Jehovah Rapha –Exod. 15:26) promised us a wholesome healing if we do the needful as contained in 2 Chron. 7:14:

If My people who are called by My name will humble themselves, and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land.

3. You need faith to benefit from God's healing power:

God's healing power is like a latent force that needs to be activated to release its potential. It can remain forever dormant to those who do not have FAITH which is the key to ignite it into action. At times, it is not just basic faith, but desperate faith that ignites the hidden potentials of this power. The four men carrying the paralytic to Jesus for healing, as read in today's Gospel reading (Mark 2:1-12), exercised such a desperate faith that got them noticed by Jesus. It was a kind of faith that could not be deterred by any barrier; they uncovered the roof and from there let down the paralytic on his sick bed. The Bible says in v.5 – When Jesus saw their faith, He said to the paralytic, "Son, your sins are forgiven you." He got double; and that is what your insurmountable faith can fetch you. Go ahead now and believe God for your perfect healing from whatever form of affliction that has been troubling your peace

4. Prayer has a role to play in God's manifestation of His healing power

Apostle James' admonition in verses 13-15 of the 5th chapter of his general epistle succinctly captures the essence of prayer in evocation of God's healing power upon the sick.

Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing psalms. 14 Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. 15 And the prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise him up. And if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven.

Such prayer for healing may be accompanied with anointing; it is Scriptural.

5. God uses human vessels to minister His healing power:

In today's Old Testament reading, Naaman, the commander of the Aramean army, seeks out Elisha in order to be healed of leprosy which constitutes a big "minus" to his towering achievement. Wealth without health is meaningless; many wealthy people with life-threatening sicknesses would rather give up their wealth for health. Pride of life achievements mixed with contempt for the "poor prophet", as he would naturally see Elisha, serves as barrier to his experiencing God's healing power. God would however not come down from heaven to do the job he has assigned to prophets. Naaman is healed when he obeys Elisha's instructions. James' admonition is that the sick should 'call for the <u>elders of the church</u>, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord'.

The prosperity emanating from our belief in the ministry of God's prophets (bishops, priests, pastors and ministering elders) according to Jehoshaphat in 2 Chron.20:20 is comprehensive and includes victory, deliverance, healing, restoration, breakthrough and such blessings as God can release upon His people. Contemptuous disposition to and treatment of God's servants and messengers ordained and assigned by God for our spiritual nourishment, growth and sustenance serves no purpose than to dispossess us of blessings that God may choose to release through them.

The summary of it all is that God's Healing power is ours to graciously evoke by means of Faith through prayer of self and elders. It is readily available; Jesus calls it "children's bread" which belongs to children of God by right but does not serve them until it is evoked.

Let us begin to see the possibility of our all-round healing by the power of God in Christ, so we can ask for it in the name of Jesus and receive according to His promise (John 14:13,14).

3. WORSHIP SERVICE

Sometimes we refer to our gathering in the presence of God as WORSHIP SERVICE. Service within this sense and context is a NOUN. Service in that God services us like a vehicle, changing and cleaning our spiritual plugs, reviling, refueling and overhauling us through His words purging us as we partake of His body and blood, as we praise Him, as we seek Him in prayer after the contaminations and bastardization of the previous week, He makes us better, lifting burdens, destroying satanic yokes refilling us with vigour to face the rigours of the new week overcoming trials, tribulations, temptations, troubles etc.

D. <u>WORSHIP AS DISTINCT FROM SERVING</u> <u>GOD: 2 CHRO.7:19.</u>

The case study of Nebuchadnezzar, Daniel and the three Hebrew men is valid here. All were in the service of Nebuchadnezzar with Daniel's influence spanning three different Kings. Yet he refused to stop praying to the living God and the three Hebrew men refused to bow to worship the golden image. Dan. 3:8-30, Dan. 6:7-28, Deut. 30:17. They served but5 never worshipped.

E. WORSHIP: THE TWO SIDES

1. Public 2. Private Both are essential, significant, desirable and expedient.

F. <u>PUBLIC WORSHIP: THE BENEFITS</u>

- 1. Open professing of faith in and love to Christ.
- 2. It preserves a sense of religion in mind without which the society could not exist well.
- 3. It enlivens devotion and promotes zeal.
- 4. It is the avenue to receive instruction and consolation.
- 5. It affect an excellent example to other and excite them to fear of God.

G. <u>IDEAL PUBLIC WORSHIP.</u> This should be:

- 1. Solemn not light and trifling Ps. 89:7
- 2. Simple not pompous and ceremonial Is. 62:2.
- 3. Cheerful and not with forbidding aspect Ps. 100:1-5.
- 4. Sincere and not hypocritical Is. 1:12; Matt. 23:13, Jh. 4:24.

- 6. Lateness should be abhorred.
- 7. Lukewarmness and indecency must be eschewed

H <u>PRIVATE WORSHIP</u>

- 4. Supplication for ourselves and others
- 5. Earnest desire of the enjoyment of God
- 6. Frequent and regular.

BIBLE TEACHING OUTLINE WORSHIPPING AND SERVING THE LORD ARIGHT JOHN 4:19-24, EXOD. 23:25; MATT. 4:10

- A. <u>AIM:</u>
 - 1. To distinguish between worshipping and serving God.
 - 2. To encourage all to be actively involved in the two
 - 3. To prepare the people to fully maximize the benefits in worship and serving God aright.

B. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

February of every year in the Anglican world has therein weeks set aside statutorily and constitutionally to assess the work of the church over the past year. This has remain a Godly custom which stands out the Anglican Communion from others, moreso in the light of the need for accountability as entrenched in the Bible and as desired and exemplied by God because we serve a God who holds us accountable 1 Cor. 4:1-4; Matt. 25:14-30. While this meeting which is otherwise an equivalent of AGM is desirable, the focus most of the time more often than not is on the monetary aspect at the expense of other salient issues.

Today by the leading of the Lord, we shall by this teaching which coincides with our annual vestry meeting look at our WORSHIP and SERVING life in the past one year with reference to our God and maker with a view to charge us to brace up, do much more and become better.

C. <u>DIFFERENCE BETWEEN WORSHIPPING</u> <u>& SERVING</u>

Worshipping and Servicing appear interwoven but they are distinct though related.

1. WORSHIP

The act of showing respect and love for God especially by praying with other people who share in the same belief. Worship is an excessive admiration for someone. This is synonymous with ADORE, DEIFY, GLORIFY, REVERENT, VENERATE etc.

2. <u>SERVE (VERB)</u>

To serve in the context of this teaching is to be a SERVANT. To hold an office, discharge a duty or function. To wait on others, to attend, to give the service and respect due to a superior. To perform the duties of an office or post. To wait on at table Acts 6:1-7. To furnish or supply with something needed or desired.

A servant is one that serves others, one that performs duties about the person of a master. It is in this sense that we are called SERVANT of God in that JESUS is our MASTER and we do His will. We are not servants as in the sense of muslims. We are His adopted children yet serving Him – Jh. 1:11-13; 1 Cor. 7:17-24; Phil. 1:1.
